Admission Policy

To be admitted to Presentation College, students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.0 and a minimum ACT composite score of 18 (940 SAT) or successful completion of the General Education Development (GED) certificate.

New students must submit the following:

- 1) Completed admission application form
- 2) \$25 non-refundable application fee.
- 3) Official high school transcript or official GED scores.
- 4) ACT or SAT scores.
- 5) Official copies of transcripts from other post secondary schools attended, if any.
- 6) Home schooled students must also provide an official transcript from the local home schooling guild, association, school, or detailed course descriptions, proficiency levels and textbooks used.
