Admission Policy

To be admitted, students must earn a C (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or higher GPA in these required high school courses:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Advanced Mathematics *
- 3 years of Lab Science **
- 3 years of Social Science
- 1 year of Fine Arts

AND meet one of the following requirements:

- Rank in top 60% of H.S. graduating class
- Composite ACT score of 18 or higher (950 SAT '16)
- H.S. cumulative G.P.A. of at least 2.6 on a 4.0 scale.

*Advanced Math must be algebra or any higher level math course

**Lab Science must be biology, chemistry, physics or approved physical science course.

Admission Procedure

Students must submit the following:

- Admission application
- \$20 application fee
- High school transcript
- ACT or SAT scores
